

Professor Rosemary I. Effiong is an Analytical Chemist. She is a Consultant in STEM with emphasis in Chemical Education, Grants and Proposals. She obtained a B. A life of time commitment to community service, civil rights and equality have been expressed by Lonnie by his service on a dozen non-profit boards over 40 years. His volunteer work with NAACP has included:Four terms as Branch President, NAACP State Conference Vice President, Branch Secretary and Treasurer, Youth Council Advisor, Executive Committee, Chair, Labor and Industry, Education, Housing, Freedom Fund and Financial Empowerment.

African Community Leadership Award Victor Wowo Sr.



Ambassador Victor Wowo Sr. was the Co-founder of the African Union of Northern Nevada (AUNN). He was the first President of the AUNN; he is the first Ambassador of the AUNN. He is the Register Resident Agent of the both AUNN and Nigerian Association of the Northern Nevada (NANN). He served as the Chairmen of NANN for one year and six months.

He served as the Chairman for the AUNN end of year party in 2013. He is the current Chairman of this year festival. He is a married man, four children and a granddaughter.

MALARIA AND THE ANTI-MALARIA BED NETS PROJECT

Malaria is a disease which causes its victims to experience high fever, headache, vomiting, loss of appetite, anemia, aches, pains, etc. and sometimes death. It is caused by the mosquito parasite which feeds on human blood. In 2010, the Center for Disease Control (CDC) estimated 219 Million cases of malaria world-wide. Of that number, 660,000 people died of the disease, 600,600 (91%) deaths were in Africa.

The impact of this disease in the lives of pregnant women, young children, families, and the continent of Africa cannot be over-emphasized. Children who survive severe cases of malaria can sometimes suffer lifelong mental disabilities.

The Anti-Malaria Bed Nets Project is a modest endeavor of the African Union of Northern Nevada (AUNN) to help make a small difference in the lives of some families in Africa. The goal is to raise funds annually to buy mosquito nets and distribute to the thousands of poor families in various parts of Africa. Last year, AUNN donated all proceeds that were raised to UNICEF-USA funds to help fight malaria.

A mosquito net costs in the range of \$10-\$20 which is the average cost of going to the movies, and that can mean death or life for some child or adult.

We are asking for your help to help make a difference and save the lives of a child with any generous contribution. All proceeds will go towards this cause.
